



Sexual Issues Residential Treatment Program - GA

Description

The Sexual Issues Residential Treatment Program offers high staff to client ratios and curriculum-based therapy to address the specialized treatment needs of this population. Premium Services, which are based upon the individual needs of the client and family, are available. These services are provided in a self-contained facility where each client is assigned a private bedroom. The importance of family involvement and therapy is emphasized.

Population Served

This program serves males ages 12 through 17 with sexual issues.

Services

Services include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Integrated clinical services with traditional individual, group and family therapy
- Client and family-centered environment that focuses on family reunification
- Psycho-educational, process-oriented and relapse-prevention groups
- Self-contained educational programming through our onsite school
- Sex offending relapse prevention planning
- Human sexuality education
- Career and technical training
- Independent living skills
- Youth Advocacy Board
- Individual and recreational supportive activities with multiple levels of opportunity for therapeutically supervised socialization both on campus and in the community.

Treatment Team

Treatment plans are tailored to meet specific individual needs with specialized treatment modalities and protocols. They are designed by an interdisciplinary team with input from the client, his family and referral source. Teams may be composed of, but are not limited to: the client, his family, board certified psychiatrist, licensed clinical psychologists, registered nurse, licensed mental health professionals, Bachelor's level counselors and certified teachers.

Staff-to-Client Ratio: 1:4 (1:8 at night)

Aftercare and Wrap-Around Services

All discharge planning commences at the time of admission. The client, client's family, referral sources and all other identified resources are strongly encouraged to be involved with this planning. The goal of treatment is to assist the family and client in reconciliation of issues that brought the child to placement. All efforts are made to plan for a discharge to an equally or less restrictive environment. Attention is given to support services for the client and family as is appropriate, based on the level of care to which the client is discharged.
