



Foster Care and Community Programs – North Carolina

Description

KidsPeace Foster Care and Community Programs (FCCP) is a community-based therapeutic foster care program for children needing placement outside of their family of origin. The program serves children with a wide range of emotional and behavioral issues. The FCCP program trains qualified families in the community to provide individualized treatment to children in care. Treatment needs are best met when the characteristics of the treatment family are closely matched with the individual needs of the child. The North Carolina FCCP program has offices located in the Aberdeen region, Raleigh/Durham and Hope Mills/Fayetteville.

Population Served

The program serves males and females from infancy to age 21. Treatment services address a wide variety of social and emotional difficulties, developmental delays, learning problems, psychological disturbances and behavioral challenges. The program is inappropriate for children who are actively suicidal, active fire-setters or who are in need of 24-hour awake supervision.

Services

- 24-hour crisis intervention
- Person Centered Plans (PCP)
- Monthly review of placement
- Outpatient Therapy
- Counseling
- Outcome-based clinical services
- Regularly scheduled in-person casework services

Treatment Team

Person centered plans are updated for each child by our interdisciplinary team with input from the child, the child’s family of origin, treatment family and referral source. Members of the treatment team may be composed of, but are not limited to, the following:

- Licensed clinical psychologists
- KidsPeace family consultants
- KidsPeace treatment parents
- Certified special education teachers
- Therapists
- KidsPeace clinical supervisors
- Family of origin
- KidsPeace program manager.

Staff-to-Client Ratio

Maximum caseload size ranges from 7 to 10 children per caseworker, dependent upon the clinical needs of the children. The FCCP program will, at a minimum, meet the state requirements in regard to staffing patterns.

Hours of Operation

Notification of acceptance into the program will be provided within 24 hours of referral in most cases. Complex cases may require longer to ensure a therapeutic match. Emergency placements are discouraged but will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
