



PA Medical Assistance Sexual Disorders Residential Treatment Program – Orchard Hills Campus

Description

The Pennsylvania Medical Assistance Sexual Disorders Residential Treatment Program provides structured, staff-secure, intensive residential treatment services for male adolescents with sexually abusive/reactive issues. The program identifies key issues and behaviors that prevent a child from functioning appropriately in a less restrictive setting. The program focuses on helping clients achieve the following goals: accept responsibility for inappropriate behaviors, identify maladaptive behavior patterns, increase social sensitivity, develop empathy for abuse victims and learn long-term accountability and self-discipline. Expected length of stay is determined by clinical need and medical necessity.

Population Served

The program serves males with sexual issues ages 12 to 18 with DSM-IV diagnoses. It also serves those with mild to severe disorders and the following presenting problems: depressive behavior, history of suicidal ideation (multiple instances requiring past psychiatric hospitalization), sexual abuse victimization, poly-substance abuse, self-abusive behavior, eating disorders, mild to severe difficulty interacting/bonding and behaviors that preclude successful placement and treatment in a less restrictive program.

Services

The highly structured therapeutic program emphasizes interagency collaboration and the Child and Adolescent Service System Program (CASSP) process. Treatment plans are based on the client's individual needs. Discharge planning begins upon admission, with an emphasis on expeditious transfer to a less restrictive level of care. Services include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Individual, group and family therapy
- Group sessions that provide a variety of therapeutic, supportive and restorative treatment
- Daily goal review, behavioral evaluation and self-monitoring services
- Access to a community-based special education program or the onsite special education program
- Recreational therapy
- Family education of sexually abusive/reactive issues
- Sexual issues STRIDE group therapy process
- Aftercare planning
- Core curriculum skills program
- Sex education
- Incentive-based Tier System
- Family therapeutic visitation.

Treatment Team

Individual treatment plans are created by a professional interdisciplinary team, which may be composed of, but is not limited to, the following:

- Referral source
- Board certified psychiatrists
- Utilization review nursing specialist
- Licensed psychologists
- Registered nurses (psychiatric specialty)
- Master's level mental health professionals
- Master's or Bachelor's level supervisors
- Special education teachers
- Board certified pediatricians
- Case managers
- Child care counselors
- Recreation counselors
- Aftercare specialists
- Licensed social workers.

- Biopsychosocial history
- Current psychiatric, psychological evaluations
- Pertinent medical data
- Current Individualized Education Plan (IEP), relevant educational information and reports
