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KidsPeace Offers New Preschool Program at Graham Lake Campus for Children Ages 3 to 5 with Learning and Developmental Challenges

ELLSWORTH, ME (**January 19, 2016**) - KidsPeace is now accepting referrals for a new preschool program for children with learning and developmental challenges ages 3 to 5, at its Graham Lake Campus in Ellsworth, ME.

KidsPeace New England (located in Maine) offers a variety of programs and services to families with children ages 3 to 20 who have been identified with autism, developmental disabilities, and behavioral health needs. The Graham Lake Campus provides non-medical interventions for children and their families in its 24-Hour Residential Program.

KidsPeace also provides Day Treatment services through its Maine DOE licensed special purpose private schools in Ellsworth and East Millinocket. This service is available to residential clients and the surrounding regional public schools for students in grades K-12.

To further meet the needs of children and families in the local communities, KidsPeace has launched the *Milestones* Program to provide essential Day Treatment services to children ages 3 to 5 with learning and developmental challenges.

The newly licensed *Milestones* Program, located at the Graham Lake Campus, will provide individualized preschool programs and daycare services, including speech therapy, physical therapy, individual and family therapy, case management, and applied behavior analysis services.

The program is designed to serve younger students in need of a structured, small-group educational environment. Using the KidsPeace Model of Care, children in the *Milestones* Program can receive the education, support, and treatment needed to help them meet their developmental milestones in preparation for public school.
