Former KidsPeace clinical manager returns to leadership role for residential treatment operations in Bowdon, GA

BOWDON, GA (March 29, 2016) - KidsPeace announced that **Louis Shagawat**, LCSW, has been named Executive Director of KidsPeace National Centers of Georgia, effective April 1.

Shagawat brings more than 25 years experience in the behavioral health field to his new role – including serving as clinical manager at the KidsPeace Bowdon, GA campus and as a clinical consultant for KidsPeace's Pennsylvania-based residential treatment programs. Most recently, Shagawat served as director and executive director at behavioral health facilities in North Carolina and Tennessee, where he successfully led efforts to develop and enhance services.

Shagawat holds a master's degree in social work from Rutgers University and a bachelor's degree from Mansfield University. In addition to being a licensed clinical social worker, Shagawat is an NASW Qualified Social Worker, and is certified in hypnotherapy and critical incident stress debriefing; in the latter role he earned praise from the U.S. Secret Service for counseling and crisis debriefing of agents following the 9/11 attacks.

"It is truly an honor to be returning to KidsPeace and to lead a team of dedicated professionals providing hope, help and healing to the children of Georgia and their families," Shagawat said. "I look forward to partnering with staff and the community to ensure for the kids in our facility a quality of care and treatment that we would expect for members of our own families."

"We're delighted to welcome Lou back to KidsPeace," said William Isemann, president and CEO of KidsPeace. "His work in our organization in the past means he understands our commitment to serve the children in our care, and his leadership experience will help us move forward with our plans to expand our operations at the Bowdon campus."

As executive director, Shagawat succeeds M. Scott Merritt, who left the organization in February.
