Martin also will oversee KidsPeace's TeenCentral/ParentCentral web-based services, including directing the websites' redesign and relaunch in 2017.

Martin has worked in corporate communications and community relations roles in the Lehigh Valley for 25 years for some of the region's most prominent companies and organizations - including Rodale, Lehigh Valley Hospital, Mack Trucks, and Avantor Performance Materials. He also has served in leadership and volunteer roles with several prominent nonprofit organizations, including the Volunteers of America Children's Center, Valley Preferred Cycling Center, America On Wheels Transportation Museum, and the Volunteer Center of the Lehigh Valley. From 1999 until 2001 he was community co-host on the news magazine program *Lehigh Valley Tempo!* on PBS 39.

Martin, of Upper Macungie Township, holds a bachelors degree in communications from Purdue University.
