## KidsPeace Names Randall G. Hines, Ph.D., Executive Director of Hospital Services



SCHNECKSVILLE, PA (October 3, 2017) - KidsPeace announced that it has appointed Randall G. Hines, Ph.D., MJA to the post of Executive Director of Hospital Services.

In this role, Hines will be responsible for overall leadership of the programs offered at KidsPeace Psychiatric Hospital, a 120-bed children's inpatient psychiatric facility in Orefield, PA. His responsibilities will include directing activities dealing with client safety, quality of services and operational efficiency.

Hines' career in human services and behavioral health spans more than forty years, and includes work as a hospital executive and as a consultant on technical issues for state mental health and disability organizations. Most recently, he served as chief executive officer of Anchor Hospital in Atlanta, GA; prior to that he also served as CEO of Austin State Hospital in Texas and in a number of leadership roles in statefunded behavioral health facilities in the state of Georgia.

"Dr. Hines brings a wealth of practical experience that will be invaluable to our operations at KidsPeace Children's Psychiatric Hospital," said William Isemann, president and CEO of KidsPeace. "Under his leadership, the Hospital and our dedicated team of associates there will continue to advance the quality of care for the kids who come to us for help."

For his part, Dr. Hines said he was honored for the opportunity to join KidsPeace in this role. "In my short time here, I have been impressed with the commitment of everyone toward the mission of the organization. Hines holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Alaska, and a master's degree in justice administration and a Ph.D. in counseling from St. Mary's University in San Antonio, TX.
