The playground will be in close proximity to the location of KidsPeace's three autism programs at the Broadway Campus, serving 250 local youth in those programs and KidsPeace's other community and residential programs.

Board of Associates Co-Chair Tony DaRe (left) announced at the campaign's April 5th kickoff event that the group already had raised more than half of the estimated \$36,000 cost of the new playground, and he



expects the campaign to reach its goal by May 22. "This playground is an exciting project for our group to support, because we want to give these kids the same opportunities to enjoy and learn that other children have," he said.

Alexis Harvey (right), Program Manager for the KidsPeace autism programs, has been working on plans for the new playground for several years. "Our vision is to provide a safe recreational and therapeutic environment for kids of all ages and physical abilities. It's tremendously important for their development to have the opportunity to play and engage with each other," she said. "Our

staff and the families we serve are so grateful to the Board of Associates and its supporters for their efforts to turn this vision into reality for our kids," she added.
